## When can the Juniors play at Phoenix Squash Club?

At any time on the day, subject to availability, booking through NEWI.

All juniors are reminded that it is a condition of membership that you are accompanied by an adult and that goggles are worn during play.

Enjoy your games but please do look after your Club and ensure all lights are turned off and the Club is secure before you leave.

Note - membership numbers must be quoted for all bookings and cards produced on request by any member.

Organisational changes are being made in North Wales squash from April 2003 which are fully supported by Wrexham Squash in looking to a programme of continuous development and excellence for juniors.

The Centre of Development will return to the Phoenix Club from Wednesday, 30th April, to be known as the Centre of Local Development (COLD). This is an important change which will mean that juniors selected, from the age group up to age 13 years, will join one of three squads of four players for a one hour fairly intensive session with a qualified

coach. It is anticipated the juniors will benefit from this type of emphasis in small groups.

For players who are making the grade in North Wales from the 14 to 19 age group, there may be the opportunity for them to progress into the Centre of Regional Development (CORD).

The CORD will take the better players from each COLD in East North Wales (Wrexham, Flintshire and Denbighshire) as part of a higher level coaching programme.

Players at this grade who show potential may develop further into an elite squad to be known as the Centre of Regional Excellence (CORE) which bring together the best payers from the East and West CORDs.

The Structure and Pathway for North Wales Junior Squash in 2003 will be co-ordinated by William Griffiths, as follows:

Centre of Regional Excellence (CORE) North Wales

Centre of Regional Development (CORD) East

Centre of Local Development (COLD) Wrexham

Centre of Local Development (COLD) Flintshire

Centre of Local Development (COLD) Denbighshire

With this new structure in place, it is now our intention to work to compliment this through the Club Night and through a new arrangements for the older age group, including a North Wales Junior League. It is also hoped that in the 2003/4 season we may start to integrate some of the older juniors into the senior teams playing in the North Wales League.

The New Centre of Local Development will commence on 30 April, with a reduced coaching fee of £2.75 per session— individuals eligible will be notified direct.

### **Girls in Sport**

With support from Jo Clay at Wrexham Borough Council, we are pleased to be associated with the Girls in Sport initiative that will encourage Year 10 students from the St Davids and Groves High Schools to try squash.

The students will take part in a four week short course as part of their curriculum, based at Phoenix, during the school day.

If they enjoy the experience, who knows they could be future members of Wrexham Squash and possibly the Ladies Team!
